

Since moving to Hertfordshire 7 years ago I've been worshipping at High Street Baptist Church in Tring. During this time the church gained a gold Eco Church award and I've enjoyed being part of a church that strives to 'do' creation care. Prior to this I lived in West Africa and saw first-hand the effects of the climate crisis on rural communities. I strongly believe that the environmental catastrophe we face is a justice issue and the church has a vital role to play.

We were delighted to welcome 28 children accompanied by 13 adults to our two Easter Holiday Clubs. They (yes, some of the Mums participated too) spent time making colourful crosses and even a keyring and bookmarks using a range of materials. The museum Easter egg hunt proved very popular too!

Stained glass windows were a bit of a challenge but those who persevered had some brightly coloured ones to take home.

It was good to be able to serve up 14 free lunches for those children who wanted one.

Some comments from the children's feedback forms: 'the best bits were' - all of the activities; lots of fun; egg hunt; colouring in the crosses. Adults said: friendly and welcoming; amazing; good to have something to do which is free; egg hunt; thanks for the hard work.

Many thanks to those volunteers who made this all possible. Those who helped with the crafts; the 'ladies who made lunches'; and the coffee shop staff who were kept quite busy. Thanks especially to the CC&C team for their help and support.

Tuesday 9th April proved how the basement, museum, coffee shop and church can work together for the benefit of each other. Some visiting the exhibition didn't know the church existed but were encouraged by the museum stewards to see what was on offer for the children – they stayed and did the craft activities then also visited the museum having first savoured the coffee and cakes in the church Foyer Coffee Shop. I hope they will be back.
